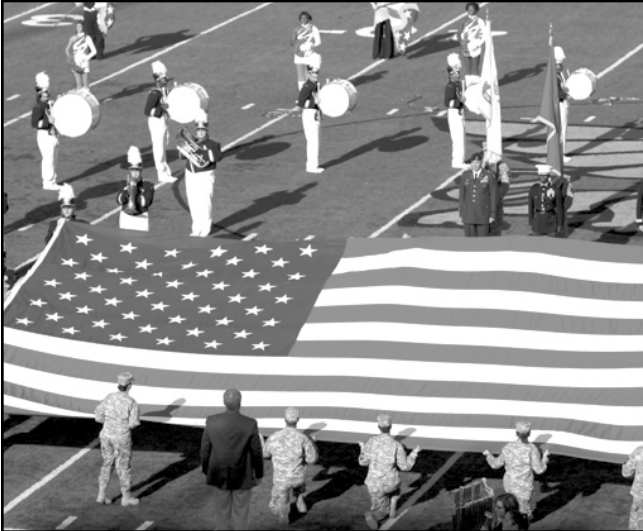
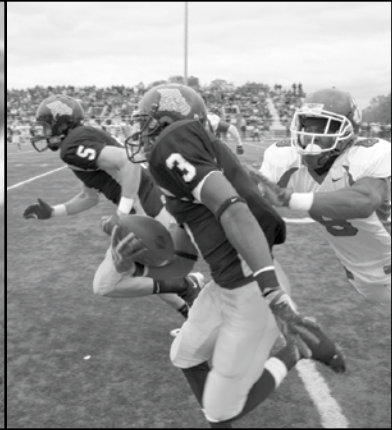

Spratt Stadium commences its 33rd season of operation in 2011. The stadium has been home to Missouri Western football since 1979, when the Griffons opened the facility with a 44-0 victory against Dana (Neb.) College. The stadium is named in memory of avid Missouri Western supporter Elliot "Bub" Spratt. Spratt Stadium's initial cost of construction was \$850,000. Lights were added to the facility six years later.



The Griffons played their first night game at Spratt on September 4, 1985, defeating Missouri - Rolla, 24-15.

In the last six years, the stadium complex has undergone major renovations with the installation of a ProGrass synthetic field turf in 2006 and increased seating capacity to 8,000 following the renovation of the visitors side seating in September of 2009. In addition to football, Spratt Stadium is the home of Western women's soccer, the Kansas City Chiefs Summer Training Camp, the St. Joseph High School Football Jamboree and formerly was the host of the Missouri State High School Eight Man Championship.

Prior to occupying Spratt Stadium, Missouri Western played its home football games at Noyes Field, a city-owned facility in midtown St. Joseph.

The Griffons hosted six football games last season and went a perfect 6-0 at home, the best record all-time at home. The Griffons went 5-0 in 2003 and 4-0 in 2006. The Griffons' largest crowd came on September 25 in a 42-25 victory over Pittsburg State. The crowd was the 12th largest home crowd since 1989. In 2009, the game vs. 6th ranked Northwest Missouri State drew a record crowd of 10,129 fans at Spratt Stadium. That broke the previous all-time attendance record which was set in 2007 as 9,007 fans saw the Griffons take on Northwest.

With construction of several new amenities, the Spratt Stadium Complex continues to be one of the best venues in the MIAA. Below illustrates the various projects that have been completed in the last six years.

Griffon Indoor Sports Complex



The lobby of the facility features a comfortable waiting area along with two 55-inch flatscreen televisions which display cable programming along with a closed circuit network in which the coaching staff can display daily announcements and schedules.



This view shows the break room along with a look down the hallway of the football offices. The front hallway features six football coaches offices while the back hallway houses the Griffon baseball, softball, soccer, golf and tennis programs. All of the building's offices include a 45-inch flatscreen television.



This spacious conference room sits directly across the hallway from the football offices. This area will allow the football staff and other members of the Griffon Athletics Department a great space to conduct meetings and other group activities.



This hallway view looks back at two of the eight St. Joseph NewsPress/St. Joseph Cablevision meeting/classrooms in the building. Each room has a dry erase board and state-of-the-art audio visual equipment, great for individual position meetings and is used for Health, Physical Education and Recreation classes.



This view looks back from the coaches' office suite toward the building's lobby. The front lobby of the building looks out at Spratt Stadium and the newly named Clark/Shields plaza in honor of Dirck Clark and Charlie Shields. These two men were instrumental in bringing the Chiefs Training Camp to St. Joseph and securing the funding for the Griffon Indoor Sports Complex.



The 120-seat KCP&L theater allows the Griffon Football team to hold full team meetings, or, with the use of a partition, the ability to split the room and have separate offensive and defensive meeting at the same time. This room is equipped with state-of-the-art audio visual equipment, including two large projection television screens and surround sound. The theater resides just across the hall from the football locker room and training room.



Class Facility



The views above and below show the spacious NFL-quality training room connected to the locker room. Ample taping stations, training tables and other equipment essential to the health of student-athletes are all included in this area. A triage area is located in the rear of the room, along with two hydrotherapy pools.



The 5,500 square foot Herzog Strength Training Room is located adjacent to the indoor field. The latest technology in Hammer Strength Equipment logoed with Griffon decals is available for the exclusive use by Griffon student-athletes.



Each Griffon football student-athlete will have the exclusive use of their own NFL quality wood locker. Each locker was custom made and includes ample space for equipment, gear and other personal belongings. Each locker also includes an electrical outlet.



This view shows the front of the football locker room. The locker room includes 120 wood lockers, equipment room, spacious showers, rest-room facilities and training room located just steps apart. This area is the envy of many, not only in the MIAA and NCAA Division II, but at all levels of football.



This wide view of the indoor field portion of the complex displays the spaciousness of the facility. The field itself is regulation size and is an exact replica of the Griffon game field. The field also includes markings for soccer and netting hanging from the ceiling to allow the Griffon softball, baseball and golf teams to conduct practices if needed. The facility is climate controlled for comfortable practice conditions 365 days a year.

Radio

680 KFEQ is the radio home to Griffon Football for the 22nd consecutive year. Dave Riggert begins his first season as the lead play-by-play voice, while Hall of Fame broadcaster Bob Orf joins him for color analysis. Kent Heier and Brett Esely will split sideline reporting duties. Coverage begins one hour prior to kickoff with the Heartland Sports Medicine Pre Game Show. With a 5,000-watt signal, KFEQ can be heard in several states throughout the Midwest.

Riggert, also the Sports Director at ESPN 1550 Radio in St. Joseph will cover Griffon Football throughout the season. He will broadcast his show (which airs 12 - 1 PM daily) every Monday from the Griffon Luncheon at 36th Street Restaurant and will carry weekly coaches press conferences live as well as interview Griffon student-athletes, coaches and staff about the weekly happenings within the department.



Television

The 2011 Missouri Western football media guide has been developed to assist all media with coverage of the Griffons. Please look over the following paragraphs to become familiar with Western media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the local, regional and national media are encouraged to attend all Griffon home games at Spratt Stadium. Please direct all press credential requests to Trevor Berneking, Sports Information Director. Space is limited on the Press Box Level at Spratt Stadium and requests close to kickoff run the risk of not being granted. Please submit all requests at least 48 hours prior to game time. Credentials can be picked up at the will call table in front of Spratt Stadium. Parking is on a first-come, first-served basis in the parking area. The lot located directly in front of Spratt Stadium (Lot 1) is available for MWSU media outlets as well as the MWSU Stadium Club.

RADIO BROADCASTS

Spratt Stadium is equipped with enough phone lines for three radio broadcasts, two of which are already reserved for Western and opponent broadcasts. Those wishing to broadcast football games should request a phone line well in advance of the game in order to ensure a spot.

PHOTO POLICY

Photographers are welcome to shoot Western football games, but only after receiving consent from the Assistant AD - External Relations or the Sports Information Director. On-the-field shooting is also welcome, but must be taken behind the NCAA-mandated 12-foot line.

INTERVIEW POLICY

With five minutes left to go in the game, a member of the MWSU media relations staff will solicit working press for names of players to be interviewed. Following a ten-minute cooling period, Coach Partridge will meet the media in the KCP&L Theater in the Griffon Indoor Sports Complex. During this time, student-athletes will be interviewed by Eagle Radio. Following Coach Partridge's comments, he will then head to the third floor of the Spratt Stadium press box for his interview with Eagle Radio and requested players will be available in the KCP&L Theater.

USE OF LOGO

The Missouri Western State University Athletics Department has been approved to use a distinct colored version of the institutional logo with color of gold being PMS 123. The athletic teams are referred to as the Griffons, both the male and female teams. Unacceptable references are "Golden Griffons," or "Lady Griffons." The 1977 football team was inducted into the MWSU Hall of Fame in 2010. The team won the Boot Hill Bowl by a score of 35-30 over Benedictine on November 19, 1977. They finished the season with an 8-2-1 overall record and a 4-2-1 CSIC record.



The 2003 MIAA regular season champion and Mineral Water Bowl championship team finished the season with a 9-3 overall record and beat Concordia-St. Paul 24-14 in the Mineral Water Bowl.



The Griffons won their third Mineral Water Bowl in 2005, defeating Concordia-St. Paul 35-23. Western finished the season with a 9-3 overall record and a 6-2 record in the MIAA.

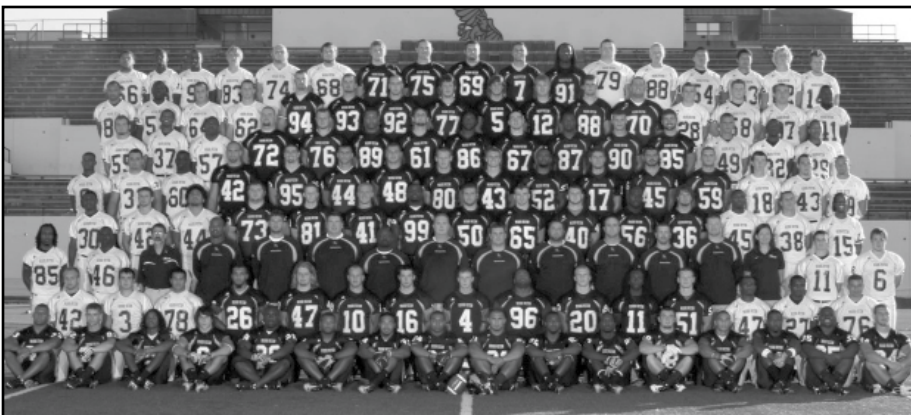
Western made its first trip to the NCAA Division II National Playoffs in 2006. The Griffons took on Midwestern State in Wichita Falls, Texas, and finished the season with a 9-3 overall record and a 7-2 MIAA record.



Missouri Western won its fourth Mineral Water Bowl Championship in 2007 by defeating the Wayne State (Neb.) Wildcats, 20-14. Overall, the Griffons finished 9-3, which was the fourth time in five years the team set a school record for wins.



Missouri Western won its fifth Mineral Water Bowl Championship in 2009 by defeating Augustana College (S.D.), 34-21. Overall, the Griffons finished 9-3, which was the fifth time in seven years the team set a school record for wins.



Western made its second trip to the NCAA Division II National Playoffs in 2010. The Griffons took on Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, Mo., and finished the season with an 8-4 overall record and a 6-3 MIAA record.

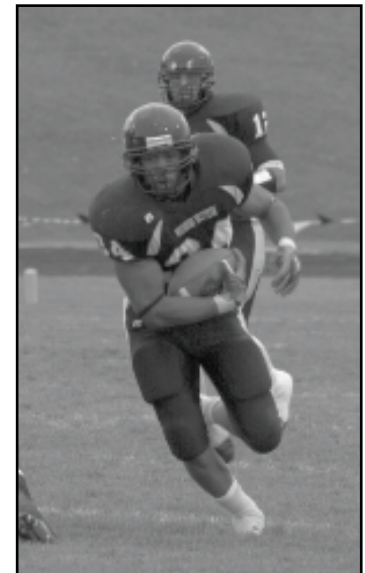

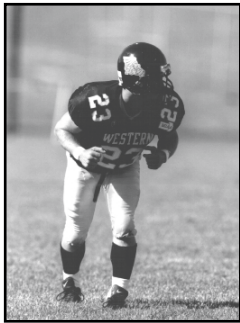

Gary Hazelrigg continues to be the Sports Medicine Coordinator for Heartland Regional Medical Center and coordinates services to Western. Hazelrigg has previous ties to Western Athletics, serving as an assistant professor and head athletic trainer for the university during the infancy of the Athletics Department and is a member of the MWSU Athletics Hall of Fame.

On campus, the Griffon Sports Medicine Program is led by Head Athletic Trainer Myron Unzicker ATC, Assistant Athletic Trainer Kate Esely ATC and Athletic Training and Rehabilitation Coordinator Becky Johnson ATC. Together, the Sports Medicine Team has over 70 years of athletic training expertise and provides services to more than 230 Griffon student-athletes in 10 sports.



Missouri Western State University is a learning community focused on students as individuals and as members of society. The institution offers students at all stages of life the opportunity to achieve excellence in the classroom and beyond, as they prepare to be leaders in their work and in their communities.

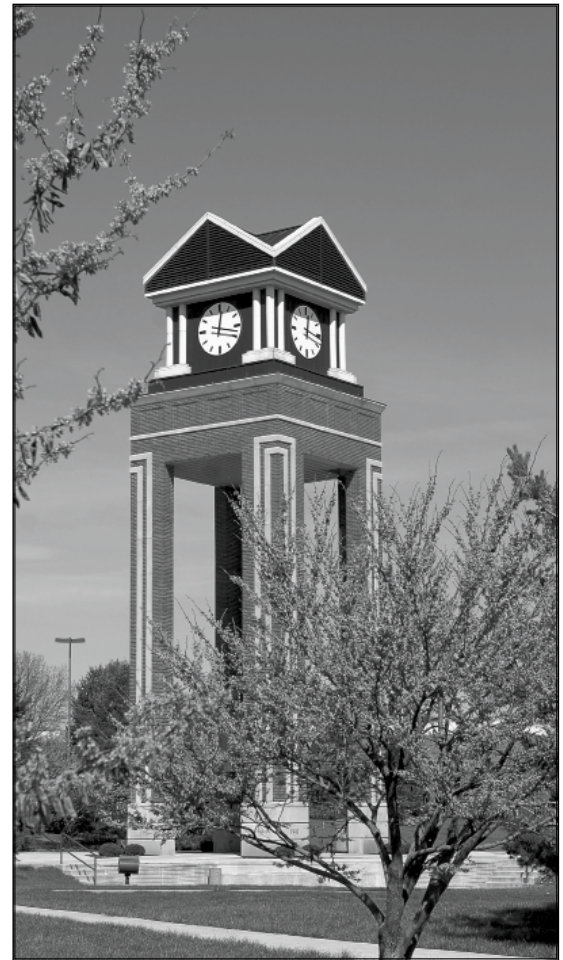
Western demonstrates a strong commitment to the educational, economic, cultural and social development of the people it serves. The university sets the standard for excellence in student development and community leadership.

Founded as St. Joseph Junior College in 1915, Western was transformed into a four-year institution in 1969 and became a full member of the State of Missouri system in 1977. It was designated a university in 2005. Enrollment in the fall of 2010 was 6,134 with more than 190 faculty members.

The student-centered, high-quality instruction focuses on experience-based learning and community service. Every classroom and public meeting room on campus is equipped with presentation technology.

The university provides a blend of traditional liberal arts and career-oriented degree programs, offering one-year certificates, two-year associate degrees, preprofessional transfer programs, four-year baccalaureate degrees and professional master's degrees.

Western's College of Professional Studies, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and Craig School of Business offer baccalaureate degrees in the fields of art, biology, business, chemistry, communication, computer science, criminal justice, economics, education, engineering technology, English, French, government, history, interdisciplinary studies, mathematics, music, nursing, physical education, psychology, recreation, social work and Spanish, as well as master of applied science, master of applied arts degrees, masters of science in nursing and graduate certificates.



The Western Institute offers applied learning, business training, applied research support and lifelong learning opportunities for the region. In addition, groups throughout the nation utilize Western's facilities for conferences and seminars.

The institution is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Institutions of Higher Education. Program accreditations include the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology, American Bar Association, American Chemical Society, American Health Information Management Association, Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education, Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, Council on Social Work Education, National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Science, National Association of Schools of Music and National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.

The campus, comprising more than 700 acres, contains seven residence halls, a residential commons building and 14 major campus buildings including 10 academic buildings, a student union, a fitness center, a conference center and a learning resource center and a new sports complex with an indoor football field. A Springs Sports Complex opened in 2011.

The campus has a large nature study area, a nature trail and nine ponds.



Western Facts and Figures

- * According to a recent economic impact report conducted by Western, the university had a financial impact of \$183.5 million on the region.
- * Missouri residents comprise 92% of the university's students, and about 4,500 of the total enrollment are from the 10-county region.
- * With approximately 550 employees, Western is St. Joseph's 10th largest employer.
- * Western offers opportunities for applied learning not always found in other colleges and universities. Last year, 3,353 students participated in applied learning opportunities through internships, practicums, research projects, study away, or service learning.
- * Last year, 881 area high school students enrolled in dual credit courses.
- * Western is engaged in several community partnerships, including the Institute for Industrial and Applied Life Sciences, Another Smart Move initiative, Northwest Missouri Regional Healthcare Workforce Development Group, and many with the St. Joseph School District.
- * The Western Institute serves as an invaluable resource for the country, coordinating the continuing education programs and conference and meeting facilities. Last year, the Institute hosted more than 28,670 visitors across the community for conferences.
- * Last year, more than 7,300 elementary and secondary students participated in camps, workshops and competitions on campus.
- * Students have high-speed internet ports in every residence hall room and access to computer labs 24 hours a day.
- * The Christopher S. "Kit" Bond Science and Technology Incubator opened on Western's campus in 2008 and is at capacity. The 25,000 sq. ft. incubator provides custom-outfitted space and support for entrepreneurs in the early stages of commercial development.
- * A completely renovated Agenstein Hall opened in January 2011. With the completion of the Remington-Agenstein Halls project, Western now has state-of-the-art science and math facilities and doubles its science and math space.

- * Over 950 new students participated in a day of service in St. Joseph, Mo., during their orientation to Western. The students served several local organizations.
- * Western was named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll. This distinction from the highest levels of government recognizes Western's leadership in helping to build a culture of service and civic engagement.
- * In the past year, Western students provided more than 100,000 hours of service to schools, organizations and businesses through unpaid practica and internships.





Academic Advisement

Each Western student has their own academic advisor within their department of study. Your advisor will put you in the best position to graduate, as well as line up valuable applied learning and research opportunities. In addition, the Western Athletics Department has its own compliance and academic coordinator who serves as a direct liaison between the student-athlete and academic faculty to ensure each athlete has the resources they need to succeed.

Center for Academic Support

The Center for Academic Support provides one-on-one and small group tutoring for most courses on campus. Located on the northeast corner of the Hearnes Center, the center consists of group study spaces and a large open area for students to receive tutoring or work independently. The center also offers free tutoring in math, writing, specific courses, reading and study skills. In addition to these services, students have access to online assistance, Supplemental Instruction, and workshops sponsored by the center.



Athletics Mentor Program

Student-athletes that need additional academic support participate in the athletics mentoring program. The program, which is facilitated through the Center for Academic Support, provides each athlete with a mentor who provides one-on-one attention on all facets of college life.

Class Size

The MWSU Student-Athlete Advisory Committee takes part in several service projects throughout the year including "Griffs Giving Gifts" and "Night Out on the Griffs."



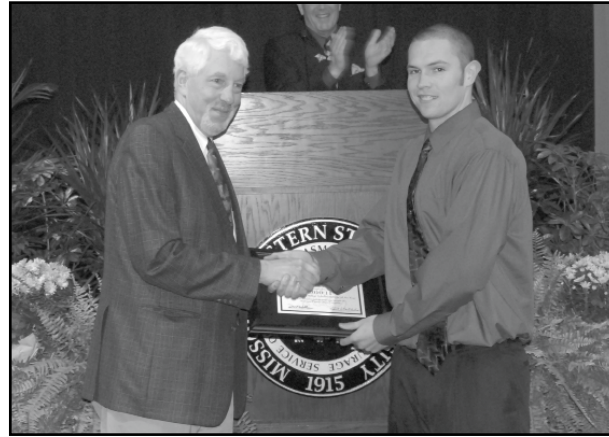

Chris Faros Scholarship Award Winners



The Don Christopher Faros Scholarship fund was established in memory of a football alumnus who was killed in a plane crash in December 1983. Chris Faros, a 1973 Western graduate, was the captain of the Missouri Western football team during its inaugural

season in 1970. He was a 4-year letter winner who gained All-District 16 honors after both his junior and senior seasons.

Faros was well respected by his teammates for his dedication and determination, and was a leader both on and off the field.

Faros was successful in fulfilling his ambitions of coaching football on the major college level. He was an assistant coach at both Colorado State University and Drake University, and held the position of offensive coordinator at Memphis State University when tragedy struck. He was among the initial group of inductees selected for the Missouri Western Athletics Hall of Fame in the spring of 1990.

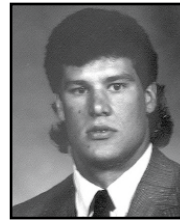
Last season, senior quarterback Drew Newhart was named the recipient of the Chris Faros Award. Newhart exemplified what Faros' dedication was like, being a team leader on and off the field.

Newhart was a fixture at the quarterback position throughout his career. He finished his career at the top of numerous categories. Newhart finished last season with a 144.5 passing efficiency and connecting on 61.5-percent (222-361) of his attempts. He tossed 25 touchdowns with a long of 73. Newhart's best game was against Truman State on October 9, 2010, where he connected on 25-35 attempts for 412 yards and two touchdowns.

Since its inception, the Chris Faros Scholarship Fund has provided a great postgraduate opportunity for former football players. The fund is coordinated by friends and teammates of Chris Faros, including Rodney Saunders, Dave Hedrick, Joe Vigliaturo and Gold Coat Club President Zack Workman.

ST. JOSEPH, MISSOURI - A GREAT SPORTS TOWN!

The city of St. Joseph is one of the best sports towns of its size in the country. In the past year alone and in addition to Griffon Athletics, St., Joseph has hosted the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball and Softball National Championships, The Tour of Missouri Cycling Race, The United States Tennis Association Heartland Classic and is the summer home of the Kansas City Chiefs Training Camp. The city is also home to the St. Joseph Mustangs, a wood bat summer college baseball team who consistently draws large crowds on a regular basis. Being located in the Heart of America and with several quality sports venues, St. Joseph is a great place to call home and a great place to compete in athletic competition.

The **St. Joseph Civic Arena**, shown below right during the 2010 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Championship is a 3,800-seat multi-purpose arena. It is used mainly to host indoor sporting events, such as basketball and arena football. It has hosted two American Professional Football League franchises, the St. Joseph Explorers in 2003 and the St. Joseph Storm in 2005. In addition to the 2010 and 2011 women's basketball championship, the arena was also the championship site in 2003 and 2004.



Heritage Park Softball Complex, shown above left before the first pitch of the 2010 NCAA Division II Softball Championship final game, is the ultimate in softball tournament venues. It features four fields measuring 300', with the fifth field measuring 250'. All fields feature championship level MUSCO lighting systems, scoreboards, and adequate seating. The complex boasts a concession pavilion, children's play area, adequate parking, and was named the 2009 ASA Softball Facility of the Year.

2011 MWSU SEASON PREVIEW

THE GRIFFON OFFENSE

The Griffons return all but one of their top-five rushers and top-five receivers from 2010. Western rushed for 1,523 yards as a team and finished the season with 2,944 yards passing. Six starters return to an offense that averaged over 31 points and 372 yards per game.

QUARTERBACK

Western will see a new signal caller under center for the first time since 2006. **Travis Partridge (6-4, 230, So.)** takes over the spot held by Drew Newhart since 2007. The son of head coach Jerry Partridge, Travis saw action in eight games in 2010, completing 11-23 passes for 145 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. The Savannah High School graduate also gained 60 yards on 13 carries in 2010, including a 25-yard scamper against Lincoln. Quarterback depth behind Partridge will be determined in early fall practices. Redshirt-freshman **Cale Grauer (6-2, 170, R-Fr.)** is the only other returning quarterback on the roster, but the Tulsa, Okla., native will see competition from transfer **J.T. Adams (6-4, 190, Fr.)**.

RUNNING BACK

Michael Hill (5-11, 205, Jr.) returns after leading the team with 704 yards rushing in 2010. The St. Joseph native split time with Thomas Hodges in 2010, but took the bulk of the carries (172), averaging 4.1 yards per-carry and had

three rushing touchdowns. Hill also had two receiving TDs and was fifth on the team with 27 receptions. Sophomore **Dalton Krysa (6-1, 195, So.)** gained 207 of his 267 total yards-rushing on Sept. 9 against Lincoln. Krysa tied an MWSU record with five rushing touchdowns against Lincoln and was named the MIAA Offensive Player of the Week. Redshirt-freshman **Dominic Thomas (5-8, 175, R-Fr.)** is a speedy back that saw considerable playing time in the spring game and looks to add depth to the Griffon backfield.

WIDE RECEIVER

The deep receiving corps returns all but one player from 2010. **Tarrell Downing (6-4, 225, Jr.)** led the returning group with 40 catches for 580 yards, and four touchdowns in 2010. The St. Louis, Mo. native averaged 14.5 yards per-catch and rushed two times for 35 yards. Speedster **T.J. Fannin (5-11, 205, Jr.)** made use of increased playing time with 31 catches for 429 yards and two touchdowns. **Adam Clausen (6-4, 225, Sr.)** tied Fannin for fourth on the team with 31 receptions for 388 yards. Clausen also snagged four touchdowns, including the game winner at Nebraska-Omaha. **Tyron Crockum (5-11, 175, So.)** returns after receiving a medical redshirt for 2010. Crockum finished 2009 third on the team with 505 receiving yards. **Kyle Knox (6-1, 180, Jr.)** and **Andrew Molloy (5-11, 190, So.)** also saw time in 2010.

TIGHT ENDS

Three tight ends with playing experience will fight for playing time in 2011. **David Fowler (6-4, 245, Sr.)** started 11 games last year, catching 17 passes for 175 yards with two touchdown receptions. **Kip Peters (6-3, 220, Sr.)** started one game in 2010, and had 125 yards-receiving in 2009. Fowler and Peters will be pushed by **Reggie Jordan (6-3, 220, So.)** who appeared in four games last year, and saw time in the spring game where he caught a touchdown.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The Griffons return three starters up front from the 2010 squad. **Macon Allan (6-5, 277, Jr.)** started all 12 games at right tackle in 2010 and has started all 24 games of his career. **Brian Chiles (6-3, 300, Jr.)** started all 12 games at right guard, and **Colt Schulte (6-6, 305, Jr.)** started every game at left guard. **Kyle Hoyt (6-2, 250, Jr.)** started two games at center last year, but will be pushed to replace departed senior Andrew Gilmore by Nebraska-Omaha transfer **Michael Yardley (6-2, 285, Jr.)**. With Schulte likely moving to tackle in 2011, **Nick Clark (6-4, 250, Jr.)** and **Sam Azevedo (6-6, 290, Jr.)** will vie for Schulte's vacated guard spot. Clark appeared in two games last year and Azevedo is a transfer from the University of Mary.

2011 MWSU SEASON PREVIEW

THE GRIFFON DEFENSE

The Griffons look to improve on a stellar defensive campaign in 2011. Western finished first in the MIAA in pass-defense (198.3 yards per-game), interceptions (22) and turnover margin (+10). The Griffons were also second in the conference in scoring-defense, holding opponents to 22.2 points per game. The 2011 defense features a preseason All-American, a 2010 All-Region player and three 2010 All-MIAA selections.

DEFENSIVE LINE

The talented defensive front is anchored by 2011 preseason All-American **David Bass (6-4, 254, Jr.)**. The big, athletic defensive end has 14.5 career sacks and was named second team All-MIAA in 2010. Defensive end **Ben Pister (6-4, 245, Jr.)** came on strong late in 2010, finishing with 33 tackles and 4.5 sacks. In the middle, **John Brown (6-1, 280, Jr.)** returns after starting all 12 games in 2010, finishing with 25 tackles. **Sean Tray Bryson (6-3, 240, Jr.)** started 11 games inside and finished with 25 tackles and 1.5 sacks. **Oliver Pryor (6-4, 260, Sr.)** played in 11 games with 17 tackles, one sack, one fumble recovery and a pass break-up. **Austin Baska (6-3, 240, Sr.)** played in 11 games with one start and will see more playing time this year.

LINEBACKERS

The 2011 defense will feature a deep, but somewhat inexperienced group. **Thomas Madget (6-3, 225, Sr.)** is the only returning starter. The St. Joseph native has started the last 24 games for the Griffons, finishing 2010 with 45 total tackles. The athletic **Yomi Alli (6-1, 220, R-Fr.)** will fight for a starting position and rotational play with **Wallace Carter (6-0, 230, Jr.)**, **Jake Buckwalter (6-0, 200, Sr.)**, **Cody Kremer (5-11, 220, Sr.)** and **Nic Burrell (6-1, 240, Sr.)**, among others. Carter, Buckwalter, Kremer and Burrell appeared in nearly every game in 2010 and combined for 59 total tackles.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

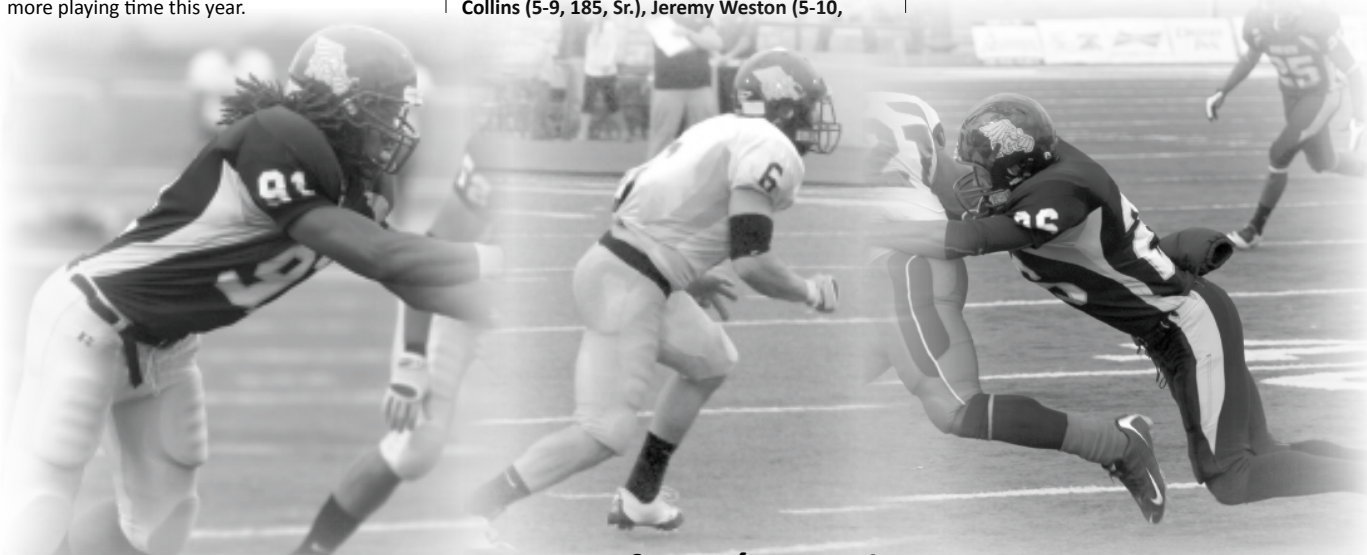
After leading the MIAA in interceptions (22) in 2010, the Griffons return two All-MIAA selections at safety, but replace both starting corners. Safety **Jack Long (5-11, 190, Sr.)** led the Griffons with 75 tackles and finished with two interceptions. Long was named first team All-MIAA and third team Don Hansen All-Super Region Four. **Shane Simpson (5-10, 175, Sr.)** had three interceptions, 68 total tackles and was named honorable mention All-MIAA. Competition departed senior corners Ian Thompson and Kendall Davis will include **Isaac Collins (5-9, 185, Sr.)**, **Jeremy Weston (5-10,**

185, Jr.), **Ben Jackson (6-0, 180, Jr.)** and **Marcus Thompson (6-0, 180, So.)**. All four contributed in 2010.

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Griffons will look to count on both kickoff teams in 2011. T.J. Fannin led all Griffon kick returners, averaging 24.7 yards per return, including a 100-yard kick return for a touchdown. As a team, the Griffons led the MIAA with a 26.4 yard per-return average. The kickoff coverage team will benefit from the arrival of Nebraska-Omaha transfer **Greg Zuerlein (6-0, 190, Sr.)**. The All-American led the MIAA in touchbacks in 2008 and 2009 and has sent 91 kickoffs into the end zone in three years.

Tarrell Downing was named honorable mention All-MIAA as a returner in 2010 and will be the Griffons primary punt returner again in 2011. **Scott Groner (6-5, 180, Jr.)**, a former Griffon baseball and Australian-rules football player will compete with **John Schmiemier (5-9, 165, So.)** to punt for the Griffons.

Meet the Griffons

The Coaches





On, September 30, 2006, Jerry Partridge became the winningest football coach in Missouri Western history as the Griffons defeated Truman State University, 38-13. Partridge won his 100th career game on October 9, 2010 also against Truman State University by a score of 29-7.

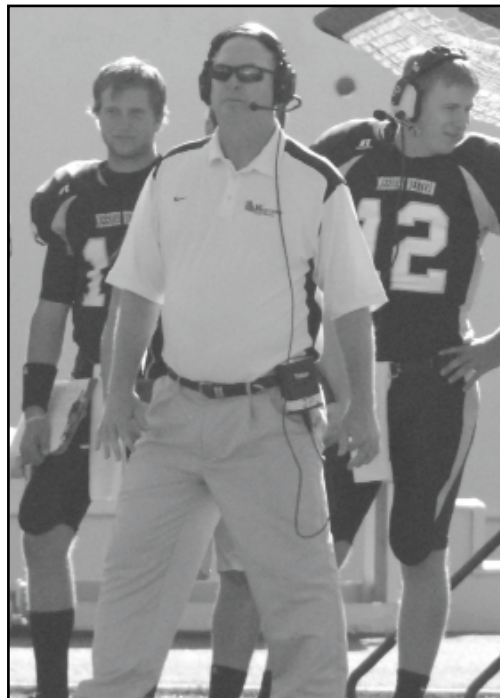
In addition to being the Griffons' all-time wins leader, Partridge's first 14 years at his alma mater have produced these impressive feats: first all-time at Western in games coached with 162; coached the Griffons' only MIAA Player-of-the-Year, Jerris Evans (2001); coached two MIAA Freshman of the Year, Drew Newhart (2007) and Roger Allen (2005); coached the school's all-time leader in passing (Drew Newhart), tackles (Eric Walker), and sacks (Eric McDowell); has had over 200 players named All-MIAA; 18 All-Americans and set the single season school record for wins with nine, five out of the last eight years and led the team to its first and second NCAA Playoff appearances in 2006 and 2010.

Partridge holds a 103-59 overall record and has led the Griffons to eight post-season appearances (2000, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 & 2010). Under Partridge, the Griffons were co-champions of the MIAA in 2003.

In 2010, the Griffons started the season 4-0 earning the highest ranking in school history of 8th in both the American Football Coaches Association Poll and D2Football.com poll. The Griffons earned their second NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. Western had two players named to the All-MIAA First Team (Sean Whitters - LB and Jack Long - FS). Western ended the season ranked 21st in the D2Football.com poll while Whitters was named to the D2Football.com Honorable Mention All-America Team.

In 2009 the Griffons got off to the best start in school history winning its first five games climbing all the way to 12th in the nation. Western finished the season going 4-3 which included a 34-21 victory over the Augustana College Vikings in the 44th Mineral Water Bowl. Western also had two players named All-MIAA First team (Nathan Martin - OL and Cedric Houston - WR). Western ended the season ranked 22nd in the D2football.com poll while Houston was named to the D2Football.com Honorable Mention All-America Team. Martin played in the Valero Cactus Bowl in Kingsville, Texas, and was named to the Don Hansen's Football Gazette Honorable Mention All-America squad. Former OL Roger Allen became the second Griffon to compete in an NFL game as he started the last regular season game for the St. Louis Rams.

During the 2008 campaign the Griffons won their last four regular season games propelling them to the Mineral Water Bowl for the second straight season. The 08 season also brought the Griffon program and Coach Partridge their first NFL player that made an appearance in a regular season game as former tight end Gijon Robinson started 14 games for the Indianapolis Colts.



In 2007, the Griffons won nine games and went to the Mineral Water Bowl where they defeated Wayne State College (Neb.), 20-13. Western has won seven or more games in eight of Partridge's 11 seasons at the helm.

In 2006 the Griffons won nine games, going 9-3, and were ranked as high as #11 in the national polls and made their first ever NCAA playoff appearance.

Partridge, the sixth head football coach in Missouri Western history, has built a program geared toward seeing his players succeed on the field and in the classroom, while preparing them for the future with a steady diet of hard work and support. Partridge sports a reputation as a "players' coach," and there is ample evidence to prove that description accurate. During the school year, hardly a day goes by without one of his student-athletes stopping by his office. He regularly meets with a committee of players and with seniors to discuss team issues – from academic requirements to scheduling to disciplinary measures.

In addition to the record holders above, Partridge's tenure has seen several other players who have cluttered the Western record book. Kasey Waterman passed for an MWSU and MIAA record 98 touchdowns in four seasons. Defensively, Partridge coached Western's first consensus All-America selection, Pierre Thomas, from 2000-2003. Thomas set the MWSU, MIAA and tied the NCAA Division II single season mark for interceptions with 14 in 2003. That season, Thomas intercepted three passes in one game three separate times. Team marks set under Partridge include points scored in a season (428 – 2007), TD passes in a season (32 – 2000), and interceptions in a season (29 – 2003).

Partridge began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Univeristy of Missouri-Columbia following his playing days for the Griffons. Partridge was a three-year letterwinner for Western from 1981-84 in the defensive secondary. While playing at Western, Partridge received a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1985 before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Missouri during the 1986 season.

Partridge served as a graduate assistant coach at both the University of Notre Dame and the University of Missouri and was a member of the Notre Dame coaching staff when the Fighting Irish won the 1988 national title by winning the Fiesta Bowl under Head Coach Lou Holtz.

While at Missouri, Partridge earned a master's degree in sports administration.

Partridge was the defensive coordinator at Missouri Western for five seasons under head coach Stan McGarvey. Partridge's Griffon defense set 13 school records including fewest points allowed (162 - 1993) and fewest total yards allowed in a game (29 vs. Friends - 1993), while helping the Griffons to 27 wins during that span.

Partridge spent the 1996 season as the defensive secondary coach at Murray State (Ky.) University. While at Murray State, he was part of a team that won the Ohio Valley Conference title while qualifying for the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs. Partridge was also the defensive coordinator at Austin Peay University in Tennessee.

A native of Grandview, Mo., Partridge is the son of Linda and Gerald Partridge, who coached at Ruskin (Mo.) High School for 29 years. Partridge and his wife, Pam, reside in St. Joseph and have two children, Travis and Lindsey.

Regi Trotter enters his fifth season as defensive coordinator and seventh season as the defensive secondary coach for the Griffons.

In 2010 Trotter's defense was first in the league in pass defense giving up just 198.3 yards per game and second in scoring defense, giving up just 22.2 points per contest. The Griffon secondary was also first in pass defense efficiency at 105.9 and led the league with 22 interceptions, three better than Emporia State. Trotter coached one All-MIAA First Team selection (Jack Long) and two All-MIAA Honorable Mention selections (Kendall Davis & Shane Simpson). Long was also named to the 2010 Don Hansen All-Super Region Four Third Team.

In 2009 Trotter's defense was second in the MIAA in total defense only giving up an average of 338.5 yards per contest. Western was third in interceptions with 16 while taking three back for touchdowns. The Griffons were also second in sacks getting to the quarterback 26 times. Trotter coached one All-MIAA Honorable Mention selection in the secondary (Ian Thompson).

In 2008 Trotter's defense recorded 15 interceptions and forced 16 fumbles. His secondary broke up 35 passes. He coached two Honorable Mention All-MIAA players in the secondary (Sylvester Gibson and Nate Bruto).

In 2007 Trotter's defense recorded 21 interceptions and recorded 13 fumbles. Last season, four of Trotter's secondary players were selected to All-MIAA teams, with one being named to the first team.

Trotter came to Western after spending a season as an offensive program coordinator at the University of Texas-El Paso (UTEP).

Prior to UTEP, Trotter was at Cortland State University in New York, where he was an assistant coach for wide receivers and quarterbacks for two years (2002-2003). His duties at Cortland State included serving as the team's academic and travel coordinator.

Trotter worked as an assistant coach for wide receivers and running backs at Missouri Western from 1999-2002. He played for Western from 1995-1998 after coming to the Griffon football program following a stellar high school career at Hickman High School in Columbia, Mo.

He was named the Griffons' Freshman of the Year in 1995, and was appointed team captain in 1998. He also received a team inspirational service award and the Chris Faros Scholarship award.

He earned his bachelor of arts degree in French and bachelor of science degree in physical education from Missouri Western in 2000. Trotter has three children: Quentin, Camille and Zoe.

Tyler Fenwick begins his fifth season at Western as the offensive coordinator after spending the 2006 season at Minnesota State University-Moorhead.

In 2010 Fenwick's offensive continued to impress, as Newhart broke numerous school records through the air, while running back Dalton Krysa tied the school record with five touchdowns in a game against Lincoln on September 9, 2010. Western also broke the school record for points in a game with 81 against Lincoln.

Three years ago, Fenwick coached the MIAA Freshman of the Year quarterback Drew Newhart. In 2009 Fenwick guided Western to a new single season record for most points scored at 451 and highest single game scoring average at 37.6. Fenwick also guided his quarterbacks to a single game record of six touchdown passes in a game against Northern State University on August 27, 2009.

While at MSU-Moorhead, Fenwick served as the offensive coordinator and also coached quarterbacks and wide receivers for one year. In 2006 the Dragons finished with a 6-5 record, which was their first winning season in seven years.

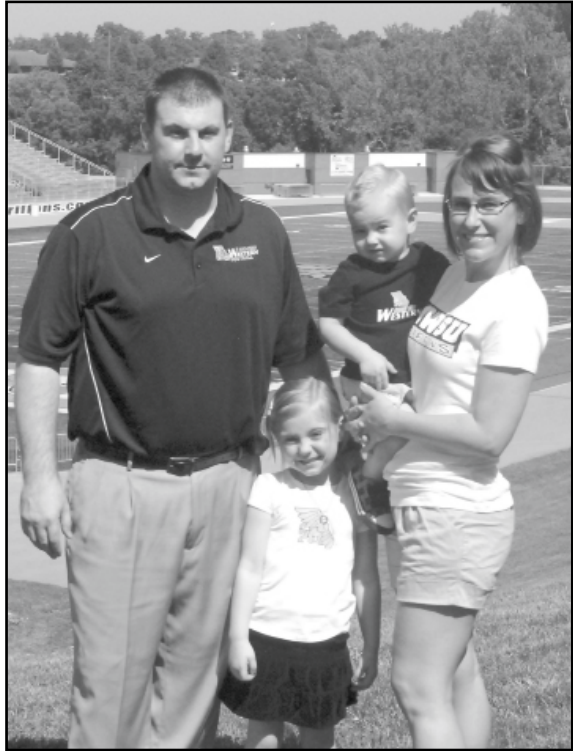

Bass led the team with 10.5 tackles for a loss and eight sacks. He also had two interceptions and four pass break-ups to go along with six pass defended. As a defense, the Griffons and 21 sacks had 64 tackles for a loss.

Two seasons ago, Bell coached a Second Team All-MIAA performer, Soane Etu, who helped the Griffons defense record 28 sacks.

In 2010 Brad Davidson was named to the All-MIAA Honorable Mention squad while redshirt freshman David Bass was the Defensive MVP of the 44th Mineral Water Bowl. He collected seven tackles with 2.5 being for a loss, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, one interception and 1.5 sacks.

In the 2008, season, Bell coached Soane Etu, who was an All-MIAA First Team selection at defensive end. He recorded 12 tackles for a loss to go along with eight sacks. Bell's two defensive ends recorded a combined 16.5 sacks a year ago.

Bell came to Western from Minnesota State University-Moorhead where he coached for two years. In his first year-and-a-half at Moorhead, Bell was the defensive line coach, special teams coordinator and strength and conditioning coordinator.

In the spring of 2007, Bell moved to defensive coordinator and coached the inside linebackers. At MSU-Moorhead, Bell coached two defensive linemen that received All-Conference accolades in 2005 and three defensive lineman that received All-Conference honors in 2006.

Prior to MSU-Moorhead, Bell coached at Southwestern College in Winfield, Kan., where he was the co-defensive coordinator and the defensive line coach. He also coached at Emporia High School during the 2003-04 season.

Bell attended Independence Community College for two years. He then transferred to Emporia State University, where he played on the defensive line. Bell was a team captain and received All-MIAA honors while playing at Emporia.

Bell holds a bachelor's degree in social science from Emporia State University and a master's degree in educational leadership from MSU-Moorhead. He prepped at Marais des Cygnes Valley High School in Melvern, Kan., where he was an All-State football and basketball player.

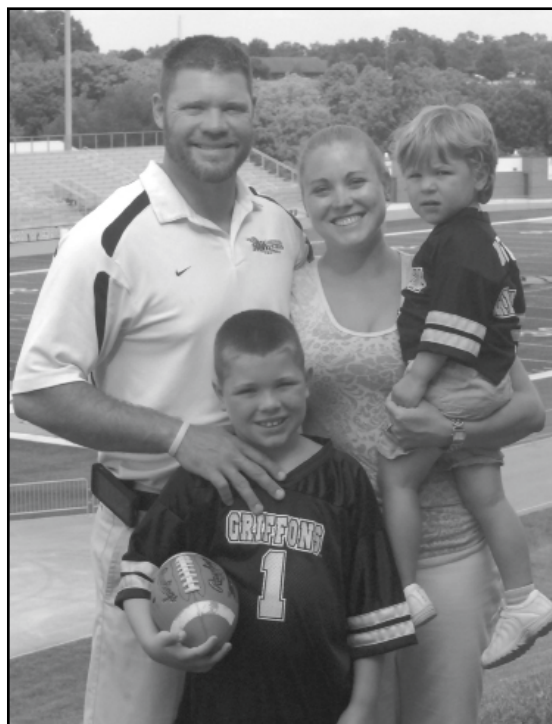

Last season Bell coach All-MIAA Second Team kick returner Tarrell Downing and All-MIAA Honorable Mention selection Andrew Mead. Mead tied the school record for most receiving touchdowns in a game with three against Lincoln on September 9, 2010. Mead finished the season with 62 receptions and 852 yards. He had 12 touchdown catches. He had four games with over 100 yards receiving, with his highest mark coming on October 9, 2010, against Truman State when he had nine receptions for 166 yards.

Western receivers caught 233 passes for 2,944 yards and 27 touchdowns in 2010.

In 2009, Bell coached All-MIAA First Team selection and D2Football.com Honorable Mention All-America selection Cedric Houston. Houston broke the single season record for most touchdowns in a season with 15.

Bell's receivers caught 226 balls for 3,151 yards and 32 touchdowns in 2009. They averaged 13.9 yards per receptions and averaged 262.6 yards per game through the air which was 60 yards better then its opponents.

Bell helped coach two All-MIAA performers in 2008 (Andrew Mead and Cedric Houston).

Bell came to Missouri Western from Fort Scott Community College in Fort Scott, Kan., where he was the defensive backs coach for two years.

Bell is a graduate of Pittsburg State University and a two-year letter winner as a wide receiver. He also received a letter for time spent at Southwest Missouri State University and Fort Scott Community College.

Todd Throckmorton starts his third season in his third stint at Missouri Western as the offensive line coach. Prior to Western, Throckmorton spent three seasons at the University of New Mexico as their tight ends coach.

The Griffons rushed for 1,523 yards averaging 3.4 yards per game and 126.9 yards per carry in 2010. Michael Hill and Thomas Hodges both rushed for 4.1 yards per carry a season ago.

Throckmorton, was the offensive line coach at Missouri Western from 2004-05, the second stint at his alma mater. Throckmorton was an assistant from 1990-96 and graduated from Western in 1987.

Missouri Western finished 9-3 in 2005 and ranked 25th in the country. Throckmorton's offensive line unit, which included four all-conference honorees, paved the way for All-American running back Jeremiah White who finished his career with 1,801 yards, an average of 150.1 yards per game.

Prior to Missouri Western, Throckmorton spent four years as the head coach at Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colo. He compiled an overall record of 11-33 from 2000-03, including 7-25 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC).

Throckmorton's Fort Lewis teams produced 30 All-RMAC performers, 14 academic All-RMAC selections and two RMAC Freshman of the Year award winners. The Skyhawks were one of the most dominant offensive teams in the league, leading all NCAA Division II schools in passing offense (373.5 yards per game) during the 2002 season.

Prior to Fort Lewis, Throckmorton was at San Jose State, where he was an assistant coach for three seasons from 1997-99.

Throckmorton spent seven years at Missouri Western from 1990-96, coaching a variety of positions for the Griffons, including wide receivers, offensive line and linebackers. He was Missouri Western's assistant head coach during the 1996 season.

Throckmorton was a graduate assistant coach on the offensive line at the University of South Dakota in 1989. He served as the restricted earnings coach at East Tennessee State University during the spring of 1990, responsible for tight ends and tackles.

A former offensive and defensive lineman, Throckmorton received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Missouri Western in 1987. Throckmorton graduated from the University of South Dakota in 1989 with a master's degree in physical education.

Throckmorton and his wife, Lea Ann, enjoy fitness, traveling and golf.

About the MIAA:

Over the past 98 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 15 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, 159 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in eight sports for men and nine for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis and golf. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, softball, golf and tennis.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State University and Washburn University became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, the University of Central Missouri, Truman State University, and Northwest Missouri State University still remain a part of the MIAA.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest, Southeast Missouri State University and Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State).

Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: the Missouri School of Mines (later the University of Missouri-Rolla) in 1935, Lincoln University in 1970, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

The 1980s brought the biggest changes in the conference. In 1981, Southwest Missouri State University opted to move to NCAA Division I and the MIAA appointed its first full-time commissioner, Ken Jones, in July.

He would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Former Gulf South and Metro commissioner Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones, serving 10 years before his retirement in 2007. Jim Johnson succeeded McFillen in July of that year and served as commissioner until September of 2010. Dr. Bob Boerigter succeeded Johnson in September 2010.

Southwest Baptist University brought membership back to eight schools in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern State College (now University) and Missouri Western State College (now University) formerly members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference, began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season to move on to NCAA Division I, and was replaced by Emporia State University in the 1991-92 season.

In August 1991, Judy Willson was hired as the MIAA's first full-time sports information director. She left in 1994, and was succeeded by Matt Newbery, formerly the assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State. He became the assistant to the commissioner for media relations in 2005. A third full-time staff member was added in 2005, as former Emporia State track and field athlete Natasha Oakes was hired as the assistant to the commissioner for compliance. Larry House joined the staff in August 2007 as coordinator of external affairs.

The current membership of the MIAA is at 12 schools, with the departure of Missouri-St. Louis in 1996 and Missouri-Rolla in 2005, the forfeiture of membership by Lincoln in 1999, the addition of Fort Hays State University in 2006 and the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2008 and the re-joining of Lincoln in 2010. UNO later left the league in March of 2010.

On July 29, 2010, the MIAA CEO Council voted to extend invitations to the University of Central Oklahoma and Northeastern State University to become the 13th and 14th members of the league, and on September 24, 2010, it voted to extend invitations to the University of Nebraska-Kearney and Lindenwood University to become the 14th and 15th conference institutions, beginning in 2012-13.

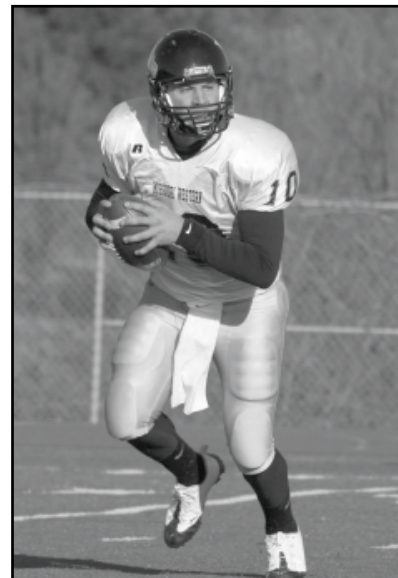

President Dr. Robert A. Vartabedian

Dr. Robert Vartabedian began his tenure at Western on July 1, 2008.

Since coming to Western, Dr. Vartabedian has overseen the construction of Remington Hall that was completed in December 2009, and the renovation of Agenstein Hall, completed in December 2010. He has taken on a campus outdoor project, including three new pond fountains, building signs and a new entrance sign. Dr. Vartabedian was also one of the campus team members to secure the Kansas City Chiefs training camp at Western, beginning in the summer of 2010. That project included the construction of a new Griffon Indoor Sports Complex. Western also opened a new Spring Sports Complex in the spring of 2011 and a new residence hall this fall.

Prior to joining Western Dr. Vartabedian served as vice president for academic affairs at Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) in Portales, N.M. In that role, he was chief academic officer for a university with a total enrollment of about 9,500. He oversaw re-accreditation efforts in six departments. The university's 2007 evaluation by the Higher Learning Commission/North Central Association was accepted without any deficiencies and was showcased as a model application.

Dr. Vartabedian was dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, N.C. from 1999 to 2005, serving eight months as interim vice chancellor for academic affairs in 2004. As dean, he oversaw 14 academic departments and four centers. As interim vice chancellor, he was the chief administrator for all academic programs for the 8,400 students enrolled.

Both ENMU and Western Carolina created several new academic programs under Dr. Vartabedian's leadership. He oversaw building renovation projects at ENMU for science, technology and music and five major building projects at Western Carolina totaling \$60 million, including a \$30 million Fine and Performing Arts Center.

Dr. Vartabedian graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor of arts in speech communication from California State University, Fresno, Calif., in 1974. He received a master of arts in speech communication from Wichita State University, and a doctorate in communication from the University of Oklahoma. He and his wife, Dr. Laurel Vartabedian, have two children: Rob, and daughter-in-law, Audrey, of Amarillo, Texas, and Sarah, of Austin, Texas; and one grandson.



Interim Athletics Director Dan Nicoson

Dan Nicoson became Western's Vice President for University Advancement in July 2004. He is responsible for the offices of Development, Alumni Services, Public Relations and Marketing, and Campus Printing and Design Services. He is also the Executive Director of the MWSU Foundation.

Nicoson coordinated the inauguration ceremonies and events when Western's president, Dr. Robert Vartabedian, arrived in 2008. He also played a key role in working with the Kansas City Chiefs for their summer training camp on campus. Nicoson also coordinated Western's more than \$17 million capital campaign, Achieving Greatness. Nicoson served as interim athletic director in 2010 for a short time and took on the role again in June 2011.

He received a bachelor's degree in secondary education from the University of Indianapolis and his master's degree in secondary education from Indiana State University. Nicoson is a Certified Fundraising Executive and has taught as an adjunct faculty member for the Indiana University Center on Philanthropy since 1982.

Prior to joining Western, Nicoson had been the President of Vincennes University Foundation in Vincennes, Ind., since 1990. Prior to that he was Assistant to the President for Advancement at Marian College in Indianapolis. Nicoson also served as the Director of Development at the University of Indianapolis.

His background in athletics began at birth. His father, Angus Nicoson, was a highly honored college athletic director and basketball coach. Dan played football and baseball at the University of Indianapolis where he later served as an assistant football coach. After leaving coaching he served brief periods as their Sports Information Director and then as a radio play-by-play announcer for football broadcasts. His son, Scott, played collegiate baseball and his other son, Brent, played collegiate baseball and golf. Brent is now the golf coach at the University of Indianapolis, representing the third generation of Nicosons to coach at the university. Dan and his wife, Linda, have three sons and three grandchildren, all of whom reside in Indianapolis.

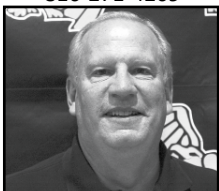
